"Value"

- I. Value influences the Church far more greatly than we have ever imagined
 - a. Value is the property of objects, physical or abstract, representing a degree of importance
 - b. Physical value and abstract value
- II. Relative value versus absolute value
 - a. Relative value is subjective and is dependent on individual and cultural views
 - b. Absolute value is philosphocally absolute and independent of individual and cultural views
 - c. Matthew 6:26; Matthew 10:31; John 6:63; John 10:29
